



MARKER BILLS IN SUPPORT OF SELF-DETERMINATION AND SELF-GOVERNANCE IN THE FARM BILL

The Farm Bill provides several opportunities to build upon the successes of the 2018 Farm Bill and further promote Tribal food sovereignty, promote Tribe-to-Tribe trade, incorporate traditional foods into feeding programs, bolster regional economies, and improve co-management activities.

Make the 638 FDPIR Pilot Program Permanent

- S.2489, FDPIR Tribal Food Sovereignty Act of 2023

Expand 638 to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

- S.2912/H.R. 5790, SNAP Tribal Food Sovereignty Act of 2023

Expand 638 to Forest Service Functions, Services, and Activities (e.g. recreational, visitor centers, trails, boat launches, etc.)

Expand 638 to the Food Safety and Inspection Service
