 2. CHAP
 3. Tribal Sponsorship: Payment of Marketplace premiums and Medicare Parts B & D Implementation of the 4-walls Final Rule
 4. Expansion of Medicare Part B AIR to all outpatient clinics
 5. Requiring QHP plans to reimburse at the Medicaid AIR for Tribal Medicaid FQHCs
 6. Amending Part D Tribal Addendum to require payment from PBMs and other issuers
 7. Requiring Medicare Advantage plans to pay tribal providers at the AIR
 8. Reducing Costs to PRC and Tribal Self-Insured Plans through Medicare Like Rates
 9. Expanding access to Tribes for Health Related Social Needs waivers
