- For SG Tribes/Consortia to date, OSG has received approximately:
 - Prior Years: **\$323,181,001** [includes **\$162,013,173 – BIL/IRA**]
 - FY 2026: **\$846,348,107**
 - Transfers received and obligated
 - Tribal Transportation and Transportation Planning
 - Final Distribution of Welfare Assistance [Actual Need]

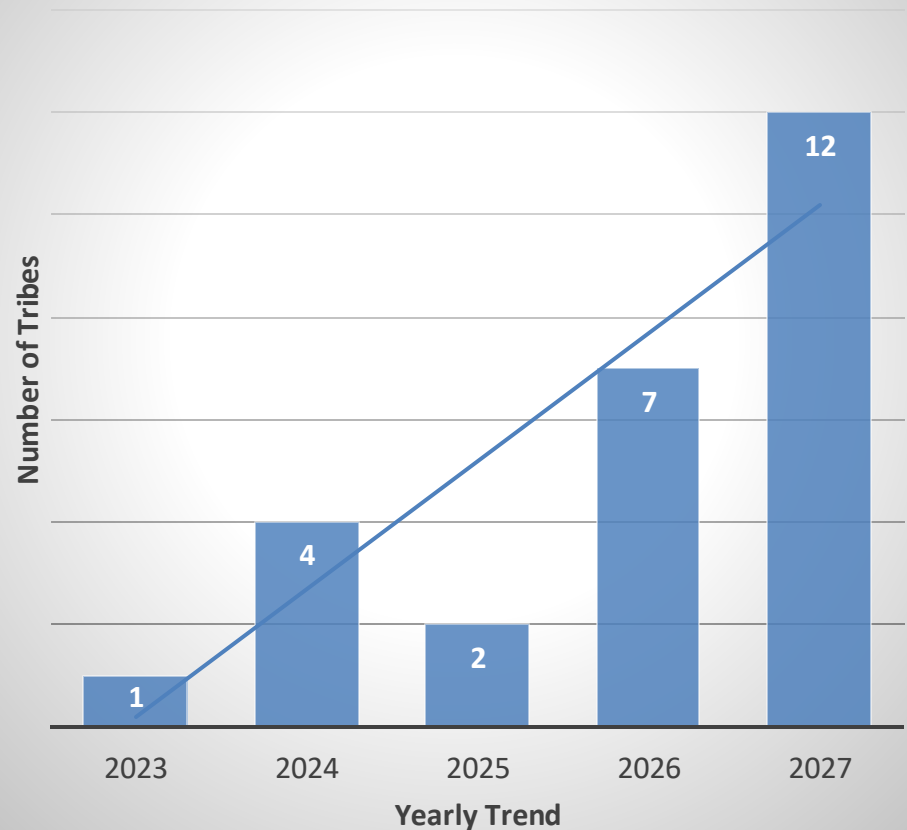


Self-Governance

- In the past 30 years, this is the highest number of new tribes approved to participate in any one year.
- Between 2000 - 2025 an average of three (3) new tribes were approved per year.
 - For 2026, seven (7) new tribes were approved, **more than double** the prior average for this century.
 - The 12 new tribes for 2027 **quadruples** the prior average for this century.
- Indian Affairs' prioritization and demonstrated support for the program are primary contributing factors to the rapid growth of the past two years.
